*For example: classrooms for licensing classes or family reunification visits, space for resource closet, etc.*

3. What prayers can you pray to ask for God's help?

4. Your existing relationships with people are your greatest asset. List the foster and adoptive families in your church, any adults who have been impacted by foster care or adoption, or anyone serving in the child welfare field in your church.
